Footnotes

IMPROBABLE held up the start up of the race while fractious in the gate but came away in good order, was eased back early then moved out approaching the first turn, went two to three wide on that bend, tracked the pace on the outside while traveling comfortably, engaged the leader in the three path leaving the backstretch, took the advantage at the five-sixteenths, was asked while moving clear outside the quarter-pole, dropped in into the stretch then was put to a left-handed whip after straightened for the drive, extended the advantage under the whip into the final furlong, remained clear under a drive into the final sixteenth then was eased up in the final forty yards while victorious. BY MY STANDARDS broke awkwardly and was off a half-step slow, moved out behind IMPROBABLE nearing the first turn, went three to four wide on that bend, settled in third position on the outside, passed the half-mile pole under coaxing, went four wide on the far turn, was roused outside the five-sixteenths then chased on the outside, dropped to the three path under a right-handed whip into the stretch, pursued the winner into the final furlong, switched to a left-handed whip at the sixteenth-pole and finished willingly for the place while unable to impact the winner. TOM'S D'ETAT stumbled at the start after standing in the gate a long time while rivals were fractious, was off about four lengths behind the front of the field, darted to the inside, saved ground on the first turn, settled at the back, went two then three wide early on the far turn, was roused while angling five wide late on that bend, raced outside under a strong hand ride into upper stretch, came under the whip at the furlong marker and finished with good courage but missed the place while clear for third. CODE OF HONOR was restless in the gate but came away in front, went three to four wide on the first turn, settled off the pace, went three then four wide on the far turn, was roused at the three-eighths, came under the whip in upper stretch and failed to rally. MR. BUFF was hustled to the lead, set the pace while well rated on the inside, entered the far turn under coaxing, was asked after being headed by the winner at the five-sixteenths, dropped back into the stretch and faded then was placed under a protective hold late.
