INNER TURF FOR TWO YEAR OLDS. By subscription of \$150 each which should accompany the nomination; \$750 to pass the entry box and an additional \$750 to start. For horses not originally nominated, a supplemental payment of \$1,500 (along with the entry and starting fees) may be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. The purse to be divided 55% to the winner, 20% to second, 12% to third, 6% to fourth, 4% to fifth and 3% divided equally amongst the remaining finishers. Weight 122 lbs. Non-winners of a race on the turf other than claiming allowed 2 lbs.; maidens allowed 4 lbs. A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track. In the event that this race is taken off the turf, it may be subject to downgrading upon review by the Graded Stakes Committee. Closed Saturday, August 17, 2019 with 27 Nominations.

FIGHTING SEABEE attained a prominent position shortly after the start, was in the two path vying for command, matched up the ground-saving FLY FLY AWAY, cleared that opponent and cut over to the hedge as the half was being completed, saw FIELD PASS assume the role of primary pursuer, led the way all throughout the run around the far turn, with the aforementioned foe latched on, was in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole when finally turned loose, dug in with good determination to preserve the decision. FIELD PASS managed to slip into the two path by the crown of the clubhouse bend, moved up to press the pacesetter right after the half had been rattled off, kept the pressure on, got called upon spinning into the lane, came home willingly but was staved off. ANDESITE strung out three wide on both turns, was let out a notch at the five-sixteenths marker, ventured onward for another sixteenth when asked for more, failed to cut into the deficit. OUR COUNTRY had the pilot take hold after stumbling badly at the start, moved onto the inside route, became very rank fightily fiercely on the bit, appeared uncontrollable rushing up to the others approaching the end of the homestretch, burrowed his way past TUGGLE along a slim opening, but not before negatively impacting the other, tipped off the inside and into path two at the top of the backstretch, tracked the front runners going about professionally thereafter, was between foes on turn two, fanned out four wide for the drive home, lacked the needed response. FLY FLY AWAY vied for the lead from the inside for a half, faltered after going six furlongs. TUGGLE forwardly placed after the field had been sent off and running, had the pilot take back crossing the wire for the first time, found itself forced into the two path leaving the homestretch, induced into doing so by a very rank OUR COUNTRY, became unsettled after becoming wedged between rivals, was steadied,required a minumun of a sixteenth before getting going properly once more, inched his way to the outside proceeding along the backstretch, departed it from path three, swung into action by angling approxitely one path farther off the inside into the lane, came up empty.
