PERFECT ALIBI rated in path two staking the front runners from midpack, slid over to the inside route once onto the turn, crept up to the ones to catch after the second split had been posted, was hand driven cutting the corner into the stretch, slipped by along a narrow but usable opening along the inside corridor, just MUNDAYE CALL began to back away, latched on to the runner up deep into the furlong grounds, igniting a spirited tussle that would last all the way to the finish line, saw the final sixteenth commence with each still abreast of each other, underwent a series of bumps with FRANK'S ROCKETTE, pilot utilizing left side stick work while the rider of the nemesis applied his from the opposite side, battled onward with good courage, cemented herself to the lead for good then edged away. FRANK'S ROCKETTE emerged from a tight pack a short distance out of the starting gate in a duel with MUNDAYE CALL, was two to three wide participating in it, was in the first stages of putting that foe away when pounced upon by the rail-skimming winner spinning into the lane, got called upon, had the top one whittle away at the deficit during the ensuing furlong then continue to do so afterwards, saw them exchange bump after bump after bump with each other all during the last sixteenth, both riders using the stick in what is deemed to be in the wrong hand in this circumstance, surrendered late and had to settle for being second best. FIGURE OF SPEECH took up the chase towards the two path, well reserved for over a half, came one path farther off the rail into the stretch, was on a true course rallying down the stretch, hand ridden with an intermittent left whip being applied, lugged in slightly the first time the rider switched the stick to the opposite side approaching the sixteenth pole, lugged in more severerely and got checked a few strides later when given a second right shot, stayed on well enough tio save the show. MISS PEPPINA cut over to the rail midway on the backstretch, took it to the end of the bend, was ridden three wide into lane, tipped a bit soon afterwards, proved no match in the final furlong. SHIPPY off the inside throughout, travelled two to three wide on the turn, fanned out five to six wide after entering the stretch, lacked the needed response. RISKY MISCHIEF departed the backstretch from path three, came up empty when asked for more leaving the three-eighths pole. MUNDAYE CALL stationed at a slight distance from off the rail, argued for control until the quarter pole before giving way.
